### AUTHORIZING THE CONTINUATION OF TNSA RESOLUTION NO. 5978 FOR PHASE 2 AT THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT PUMP STATION

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune Sewerage Authority has previously authorized award of an emergency contract under N.J.S.A. 40A:11.6 resulting from an emergency condition at the Wastewater Treatment Plant Pump Station under TNSA Resolution No. 5978 dated September 17, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune Sewerage Authority has authorized the continuation of TNSA Resolution No. 5978 for Phase 2 at the Wastewater Treatment Plant Pump Station; and

WHEREAS, the need for such could not have been reasonably foreseen notwithstanding a good faith effort on the part of the Authority to plan for the purchase of any goods or services required; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 permits a contract to be negotiated or awarded without public advertisement for bids and bidding therefore, notwithstanding the contract price will exceed the bid threshold, when an emergency affecting the public health, safety or welfare requires the immediate delivery of goods of the performance of services; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.12, contracts awarded under such circumstances are excepted from Pay-to-Play due to public exigency; and

WHEREAS, Engineered Resin Solutions, 418 W. Front Street, Chester, Pennsylvania 19016 has confirmed that they have the ability to commence the Phase 2 emergency work required upon award in an amount not to exceed \$156,950.00; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's certification of funds is attached and made part of this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of Neptune Sewerage Authority, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey herby authorizes award of an emergency contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 to Engineered Resin Solutions for Phase 2 emergency repairs to the Wastewater Treatment Plant Pump Station wet well in the amount not to exceed \$156,950.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED said contract shall be limited to duration as to meet only the immediate needs of this emergency.
